Be sure to clearly explain the guidelines and expectations to your child. Developing a good homework routine will benefit the student and you. Students will be successful learners and there will be far less frustrations for you. ST. VINCENT DE PAUL GRANTS: The Catholic Foundation recently awarded two grants to the St. Vincent De Paul Society of our Consortium. The grants were received by the parishes of St. Rose and St. Bernard. These grants are given after consideration by the committee which awards grants for the diocese *Challenge in Changing Times Campaign*. There are four categories within the grant process. The grants for our consortium were in the "Service to the Poor and Needy" category. The grant to St. Rose Parish is in the amount of \$5,000.00 and will be used to help with utility bills for the clients of the society. The St. Bernard grant is in the amount of \$1,000.00 and will be used to purchase turkeys and other supplies to continue our Thanksgiving Dinner project. Clients are referred to our center by Community Action and Salvation Army. Each month, we pay approximately \$1,000.00 for utility bills and clients are eligible once a year for the maximum of three years. Our turkeys are purchased for inclusion in the dinner supplies which are given to residents of the Southern Local School System and clients of Perry County Children's Services. We are most grateful to the committee for selecting our projects as worthy of the grants from the *Challenge in Changing Times* and to all members of the Consortium who support our efforts with the fifth Sunday collection and food and clothing for our center in Corning.
