SCHOOL NEWS: FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

It has been my honor to serve as Principal of St. Rose Catholic School these past seven years. During this time, I have been given wonderful treasures. I have had the opportunity to see children grow and learn not only academically but also in their faith. I have worked alongside outstanding teachers who have gone that extra mile to ensure that students are learning to the best of their abilities. I have traveled along with Father Jim who works hard to sustain our school and to deepen the growing faith of our children. I have had the pleasure of serving with you to help make this effort of home and school a strong union. Unless you experience the difference between a Catholic school and a public school, you do not know the bonds that cause you to love this school so deeply.

This will be my final year in education. After 43 years, I will be retiring June 8, 2015. Your new Administrator will be Jonathan Medaugh who has pledged his love and dedication to St. Rose. I am very confident that Mr. Medaugh will work to sustain the heritage of this school in our Consortium.

Finally, let me thank you for this honor. I have and will always love this school and the families who call it theirs. I plan to spend more time with my grandchildren who are 2 1/2 years old now, my 86-year-old mother, caring for my husband, learning turf management on the golf course and reading. I will continue to keep St. Rose School in my prayers and ask for God's blessing for all of you. Sincerely...Mrs. D.

BUILDING OUR FUTURE: We would like to thank those of you who continue to support St. Rose School during our restructuring phase. Like any new construction, it takes time and materials to complete the job. Our Diocese had committed to supplying our materials and we are offering our time to make it a success. Jonathan Medaugh and I are working as a team to make a smooth transition in the school leadership. It is important to us that we keep everyone updated on our plan. Therefore, we will be sending out weekly bulletins to advise you of our progress.

1) We have reduced our staff from nine teachers to six with blended classes in Grades 2/3, 5/6, and 7/8. Kindergarten, Grade 1 and Grade 4 will remain as single classes. We are wishing our blessings and success to Kindra Baker, Laura Ewing and Maggie Nelson who have made the decision to not return next school year and are pursuing other opportunities. We are finalizing the teaching assignments for our classes and will announce them next week. 2) We are receiving furniture (more tables, chairs, and desks) and some additional technology that is no longer needed from another Catholic school. Thanks be to God for their generosity. 3) We are holding weekly meetings with the Diocese leadership and our teachers to discuss the implementation of blended learning. Weekly meetings have been scheduled until the end of the school year and there are professional training dates established during June, July, and August before school starts. At our next Wednesday meeting with the Diocese Team, teachers will be working on daily schedules and the inclusion of technology instruction in the school day.

We have been making plans to move some grade levels to different classrooms and use other rooms for different purposes, such as an Art Room, Science Classroom, a Book Room or additional storage. 4) Our Kindergarten enrollment continues to rise. We currently have 12 students enrolled and are looking to gain a few more students for our 2015-2016 Kindergarten class between now and August. We have been reapproved to offer tuition scholarships to students in Kindergarten or 1st Grade entering St. Rose School for the first time through the Ohio Department of Education EdChoice Extension grant. Students awarded grants last year are welcomed to reapply for the upcoming school year. We hope you have sent in your intent to return and be with us next year. Our school is special because of the caring and family atmosphere. We will keep you abreast of the progress.
