SCHOOL NEWS:**BUILDING OUR FUTURE:**

We met with Kitty Quinn from the Diocesan Education Office for the third time on May 6th. Possible room location as well as grade assignment were discussed. Unfortunately, no conclusions were reached, but we are closer. It is a very difficult process when one asks a teacher to try something new and different. What we are being asked to do is very new and to be honest, a little unnerving.

Try to remember that one of the underlying issues is that we want to do our best jobs and there is not one teacher who wants to give less than their best for your children. So the issue becomes a very personal challenge for each teacher.

If our teachers didn't care about your students and didn't care what kind of job they did, we would be past this point. The very fact that this process is difficult is proof that this staff cares about what kind of education your child receives.

It is our intent to have the staffing issues settled at our next meeting. Anyone who is interested in "Blended Learning" needs to Google it. There are several videos online and a few articles. These films and articles do make the whole process less scary.

We want to point out that while the staffing issue is slowed down, we are progressing in other areas. We have been in contact with other Catholic Schools about next year, and those principals are willing to work with us. The office staff has established contacts with the Ohio Dept. of

Education and the Columbus Diocese in order get a head start on next year's paperwork.

Mr. Medaugh will be working with New Lexington City Schools this summer in an effort to make sure we are in compliance with the services they provide and we remain eligible for those services. Additionally, we are also progressing in preparing service projects for next year.

We are still working with EdChoice and we see this as a wonderful chance for us to evangelize and take a role in the larger community seriously.

We have been in contact with the Principal at St. Bridget's in Dublin and will be taking a look at science tables, bookcases, bulletin boards, etc. These items and many more are being donated to us.

In preparation for next year, we are going to be closing the office on Friday mornings from 9:00-10:00 a.m. so that all of our students and employees can attend the school Mass. Should you arrive late on Fridays, bring your child to the church where they will be met by an adult.

Our last Virtue Assembly was held at the church. The four chime choirs performed and between the pieces students reviewed the virtues we have learned about this year. This is another program that will become an outreach ministry for us. The chime choirs are now four years old and we continue to be amazed at the work ethic and the pride with which your children perform. It is time to take this ministry to the next level.

We are grateful that the Diocese feels that St. Rose is worth saving and we are humbled by the prospect that what we may be able to accomplish here could benefit other Catholic schools. We have been given an opportunity to demonstrate our faith and our willingness to help others. We can make St. Rose the kind of place other schools visit to view our successes, and we can be the kind of school of which families want to be a part.
