SCHOOL NEWS:**BUILDING OUR FUTURE:**

We met with Kitty Quinn from the Diocesan Education Office on May 12th. We were able to come up with preliminary teacher assignments. Mrs. Fondale will be teaching kindergarten; Mr. Ewing will teach first grade; Mrs. Shumaker will be teaching the 2/3 class and Mrs. Reed will be retuning to fourth grade. Mrs. Finck will be teaching Language Arts and Social Studies grades 5-8.

Our next project is to reconfigure the building to best serve our new needs. There is a real possibility now that we could have science labs, multipurpose rooms, etc. **If you have not re-enrolled your child(ren), please do so as soon as possible.** This will help when we start to plan for room usage. After we complete that project, we will begin to map out the school days and the school year.

At this point, we need to make you aware of some issues. We are in need of volunteers for the library, recess duty, lunch duty, etc. At first look, it appears that teachers may be giving up their planning periods and the extra help will be much appreciated.

Also, I will be traveling to St. Bridget next week to look at donated materials. These materials will be moved to St. Rose the first week of June. We'd like to have some help loading at St. Bridget's and another crew here at St. Rose. These dates and times will be established soon.

Our office staff has been researching re-establishing our web page. We hope to include Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram accounts as well.

We are encouraged by the efforts of the Festival committee and are excited about the ideas this committee has made. They are putting in a lot of hours to make this a successful event.
