SCHOOL NEWS:

AMAZING STUDENT CONGRATULATIONS: To Leah Siemer who won the VFW Honor and Respect Our Flag coloring contest. Our first graders were given a presentation from Mr. Anderson and Mr. Stickdorn of the VFW on honoring and respecting our flag. Leah was awarded a McDonald's Gift Card for winning the contest.

FROM MR. MEDAUGH:

LOOKING AHEAD: I can't thank you enough for re-enrolling your children. I am excited and happy you have chosen St. Rose Catholic School and I am also appreciative of your response because it helps me create a realistic budget for next year. At the most recent meeting with the Diocese representative, the staff discussed what we knew about blended learning and what concerns we still had. We reviewed class assignments and discussed the current enrollment figures. We also developed a preliminary building design based on anticipated use of the room, such as where we might teach science the best, or which room might be best suited for what grade, and which teachers might work together on units. My trip to St. Brigid of Kildare in Dublin was rewarding. We will be gaining almost 30 newer computers plus the tables to put them on. We are also gaining two carts that will charge 32 laptops at a time. I want to mention we need to be thankful to the diocese for brokering the deal with St. Brigid for all the equipment. The next task is to make sure our building design is compatible with the new technology. If it is, we are good to go. If it isn't, we will have to make a few adjustments. In addition to the above items, we will be getting oak library tables and chairs, bookcases, white boards, SMART boards, science tables and more items too numerous to mention. This will allow teachers to discard mismatched bookcases, flimsy tables, as well as the broken chairs we have been using. I will need about 6-8 people to help move the items from Dublin to New Lexington. The diocese is furnishing the truck. The diocese is also checking on a storage unit in town where we can put some of the items until rooms are ready to be set up. We are waiting to hear from St. Brigid on the exact dates when we can begin moving. We have purchased a new domain name for our website and are working with E-Catholic to reestablish our web page. Teachers will be having 3 days of in-services in June. We will be working creating whole units, assessing students for placement, learning how to assess student learning, and working with the I-Ready people to learn how to utilize their software. Summer office hours will be Tuesday-Thursday, 7:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Probably more once we start moving classrooms.

To clear up the Administrative Assistant position – what we are looking for is a receptionist. It will be most likely from 8:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m., and would run from mid-August to mid-June.
