BUILDING THE FUTURE: Our enrollment figures are solid at this point: Kindergarten – 12; First Grade – 14; Second/Third Grade – 20; Fourth Grade – 15; Fifth-Sixth Grade – 17; and Seventh/Eighth Grade – 16. Total enrollment – 94. There are still some students who were on last year's enrollment list who haven't sent in forms. If those students commit at some point, next year's total will be pretty close to what we had this year. Any high school students needing service hours may want to consider helping with setting up classrooms this summer.

After 3 days of in-service meetings with the Diocese, we have learned a lot to start **Multi-age Blended Learning** for the 2015-2016 school year.

I-Ready taught us how to utilize that program for math and reading, and how to use the new Google Chrome computers. We discussed the physical layouts of our rooms, and how to make and send assignments using g-mail. Meetings are scheduled with the staff from New Lexington City Schools to make sure we are in compliance with them, and to ensure that our students get the services to which they are entitled. We will develop a plan with the Directors of Transportation for New Lexington and Crooksville for safe and timely transportation of your children. Sharing some thoughts from Matthew Kelly's book, *Rediscovering Catholicism*, "If we live and love the way the Gospel invites us to, we will intrigue people. Respect and cherish your spouse and children, and people will be intrigued. Work hard and pay attention to the details of your work and you will intrigue people. Go out of your way to help those in need, people will be intrigued. When we do what is right, even if it comes at a great cost to ourselves, people will be intrigued. Patience, kindness, humility, gratitude, thoughtfulness, generosity, courage and forgiveness are all intriguing." I believe if we demonstrate all this, we can intrigue people enough to want to check out St. Rose Catholic School for their children.
