SCHOOL NEWS**FROM MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:**

LOOKING AHEAD: At three days of meetings recently in Columbus, many items were covered. We discussed school safety, curriculum, standard-based grading, dress codes, as well as diocesan policy. While we are in pretty good shape in most areas, we still have work to do to improve. There are some policies and procedures at which we need to take a look and about which we need to get serious. Among those are the volunteer policies. Everyone who works with students needs to have *Protecting God's Children*. We have scheduled a class for the Consortium on Saturday, August 8th, from 9:00 a.m. until noon. Following the session, you will be able to get your background check done at our local sheriff's office. You can register for this class online at www.virtusonline.org. If you intend to help on field trips or other activities that involve the children at St. Rose, you must have this training. Senate Bill 243 enacted a one-time sales tax holiday to occur only in 2015. The holiday starts on Friday, August 7 at 12:01 a.m. and ends on Sunday, August 9, at 11:59 p.m. During the holiday, the following items are exempt from sales and use tax: Any items of clothing priced at \$75.00 or less; any item of school supplies priced at \$20.00 or less; any item of school instructional material priced at \$20.00 or less. Questions can be answered by calling 1-800-304-3211. We will try to get you the teacher's supply lists before then. We are running behind because some teachers were not sure what they were going to be teaching or whom they might be teaching. You can order uniforms online through Schoolbelles. We do have some gently used uniforms in our "School Closet." Once fair week is over, we will establish days and times it will be open. In regards to staff, I am happy to report that we have hired Mary Ann Hughes from Logan to teach 5-8 math and science. She comes in with twenty years of experience, has developed curriculums from scratch, and has plenty of energy and enthusiasm. In order to address our math concerns, we will be doing a modified block schedule for math. This means that all students, grades 5-8, will have two periods of math each day. We have done this type of schedule with language arts for many years. This will help address several issues. It will give those students additional time to learn the new iReady math program on the computers and it will give Mrs. Hughes more time to get acclimated to the school and the curriculum. I also want you to know that lunches will now cost \$2.25 and adults will be \$3.00. To my knowledge, prices for those eligible for the National Lunch Program will remain the same as last year. One of the items that came up in our audit with the state was that we have been undercharging the lunches for several years. This increase will help us get closer to what we should be charging.

In Matthew Kelly's book *Rediscovering Catholicism*, he discusses being a better version of yourself. He quotes Marianne Williamson who is a spiritual author and lecturer. She writes in her book *Return to Love*, "Our deepest fear

is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness, that most frightens us. We ask ourselves, Who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented, and fabulous? Actually Who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small doesn't serve the world." July 27-31, I have meetings in Columbus on Tuesday and Wednesday.

NOT SURE YOU ARE REGISTERED IN THE PARISH?

You may not be if:

- You have moved from your parental home
- You grew up here **but** are newly married and starting your own family
- You are living with your parents **but** are over 23 years of age
- You are not receiving contribution envelopes

To register in our parish call the office (740-342-1348) or stop into the Consortium Office. There are many reasons to actually register in a parish.

- The number of registered parishioners helps the Diocese determine the growth and sustainability of a parish
- Often, if you are asked to be a godparent or sponsor for Confirmation, you will be asked to provide a letter from your parish stating that you are a parishioner in good standing. While that is simply a form letter, it cannot be issued if you are not in fact a registered parishioner
- When the hospital calls or if your name is on a hospital list, it is difficult to determine exactly who we need to visit if we do not have your name in the “book.”

Those are just a few of the reasons it is important to register in the parish.
