POPE FRANCIS:

Knock at God's Heart with Prayers for Your Children. A few weeks ago, I celebrated Mass in the Church of St. Augustine, here in Rome, where the relics of St. Monica, His mother, are preserved. How many prayers that holy mother raised to



God for her Son, and how many tears she shed! I am thinking of you, dear mothers; how often you pray for your children, never tiring! Continue to pray and to entrust them to God; He has a great heart. Knock at God's heart with prayers for Your children.

Christ the Good Shepherd is the Door to the Kingdom It is interesting to note that the antiphon that is sung at the dedication procession passing through doors for the first time indicates that Christ Himself is present in the procession: "Lift high the ancient portals! The King of Glory enters." Christ Himself is the door to life; and each of the casements of wood or metal which mark our churches or homes are but a reminder of Him through whom we enter eternal life. Christ Himself told us that he is the door to the Kingdom of Heaven. Christ, then, is not only the door; He is the king who enters and the temple to whom the door leads! Christ not only invites us to enter the Kingdom of Heaven through Him, He even leaves the keys to His apostles, assuring them that whatever you bind on earth, shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. (Mt 16:19).

Unlike the foolish virgins whose lamps were not trimmed in time for the wedding banquet; those who repent of their sins and receive Christ's forgiveness through the Church will not find the door barred when the bridegroom returns (Mt 25-10).
