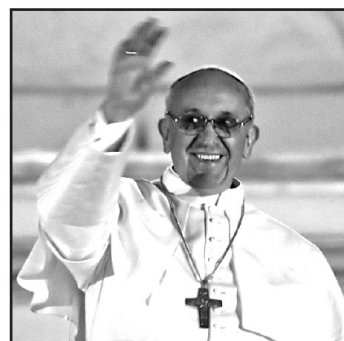

SCHOOL NEWS FROM MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:

Many things have happened since I wrote last. Even though school is out, work continues in preparing for next year. Mitch has already started cleaning rooms and I have been busy preparing for the next principal, as well as wrapping up this year's reports.

Grade cards for students who have outstanding bills will not be sent home. Accumulative folders of existing eighth graders or transferring students with outstanding debts will not be forwarded to future schools.

Otherwise, grade cards will be sent home sometime next week. If you have any questions, please call the school office.

Office summer hours are 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m., Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Mr. Medaugh will be available Monday, 7:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m. and 7:30 a.m.-noon, the rest of the week. The office will be closed June 20-21.

With the help of the diocese, Fr. Jim was able to hire Mike Lollo as your new principal. I have known Mike for years and had a chance to meet with him briefly this afternoon. I promised him as I am promising

you that this transition will be smooth. Mike and I will get together this summer and get this figured out. I am excited for St. Rose Catholic School. I believe that Mr. Lollo has the best interest of this school at heart and because of his administrative experience I am confident that he has many of the skills I am lacking.

After much consideration and discussion with Fr., the teachers, Pat Vigue, and the diocese, we have decided to stay with the current configuration of classes. This means that Mrs. Shumaker will continue to teach grades 2/3, while Ms. Harvey will be teaching the self-contained fourth grade

Mrs. Shumaker already knows how to do a 2/3 combination and I am comfortable with this arrangement. This will also give Mr. Harvey a change to continue to learn the ropes of fourth grade, where she has been teaching since February.

I am convinced that Saint Rose can be a great school. We just need to fine tune some things and we'll be good to go. People want us to do well and that is a huge plus.

Ken Hitchcock is the coach of the St. Louis Blues and was given a one year extension on his contract, which he claims, will be his last season coaching. In his press conference, he said that he was not willing to put in the work anymore to make himself a better coach. He felt that once you quit trying to get better you are actually getting worse. When you decide to quit moving forward, you are moving backward.

In my discussion with your teachers and some of the parents, I am convinced that no one affiliated with this school is content with the way things are, and only want good things for our kids, our staff, and our school. That is a good sign. With that type of attitude I am not worried about St. Rose going backward. I am hopeful that with this change in leadership and the way we collect our fees our school can continue to provide a Catholic education for the children of Perry County.
