FAST & ABSTINENCE DURING LENT:

The Church has specified certain forms of penance, both to ensure that the Catholic will do something, as required by divine law, while making it easy for Catholics to fulfill the obligation. Thus, the 1983 *Code of Canon Law* specified the obligations of Latin Rite Catholics. Canon 1251 ...Abstinence and Fast are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Friday of the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Canon 1252. All persons who have completed their fourteenth year are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their sixtieth year. **Abstinence:** Requires Catholic to abstain from eating meat on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday, **Fasting:** Requires Catholics from their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal. It is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The fast is broken by eating between meals and by drinks which could be considered food. Excused from fast or abstinence beside those outside the age limits are the sick, frail, pregnant or nursing women, and manual laborers according to need.

TUITION ASSISTANCE to the Community of Parents with Children at St. Rose School,

As I am sure you can imagine, preparations are underway for the 2017-2018 school year. And with all new beginnings, we approach the new year filled with hope and promise. With this letter, I would like to bring to your attention the important issue of tuition assistance for families unable to pay the full tuition at St. Rose School.

With the change of administration in both the school and parish office, a variety of unwritten and unofficial tuition assistance arrangements were discovered. We have done our best to honor all such arrangements for the 2016-2017 school year. With the completion of this school year, all such arrangements come to an end.

Please understand it is not our intention to bring financial hardship to any of the families sending children to St. Rose School. And we announce the termination of such arrangements fully aware and fearful that we may lose some families and students because of it. That is not our intention and we sincerely apologize for that.

What is our intention is to implement a fair and uniform process of bringing the tuition assistance available at St. Rose to those families and students with demonstrated need and where the assistance can genuinely make a difference. It is our hope and prayer that no child or family will be turned away from attending St. Rose School because they cannot afford it. Tuition assistance is available.

You are currently in the process of completing the parent-school tuition agreement. (As a gentle reminder, this agreement is due

in the office by April 30th.) If you are in need of tuition assistance, please indicate that need clearly on this agreement. The total amount of tuition assistance and the individual awarding of tuition assistance will be directed and coordinated by the Principal's Tuition Assistance Committee. No tuition assistance will be given nor will special tuition assistance arrangements be made by either the pastor or the principal.

The Principal's Tuition Assistance Committee is made up of competent, caring parent representatives committed to helping families in need and also dedicated to a fair and equitable distribution of the tuition dollars available in the St. Rose School community.

We approach the new year filled with hope and promise. Your completion of the parent-school tuition agreement will help us plan with confidence that our financial resources will properly support the overall school program. And we recommit ourselves to the formation of boys and girls who will be good citizens of this world, loving God and neighbor, and enriching society with the leaven of the Gospel.
