AROUND THE DIOCESE

CATHOLIC YOUTH SUMMER CAMP: As this semester flies by, I am beginning to prepare for the summer that lies ahead. For me this means I am preparing for another faith-filled summer on mission at Catholic Youth Summer Camp (CYSC)! This year, like last, I have been asked to raise funds to cover all of my expenses for the entire summer on the campsite. Because I cannot raise the funds without the help of others, I am asking each of you to be mission partners with me this summer. Throughout the course of 8 weeks from the middle of June to the middle of August, I will be given the opportunity to serve 1,735 youth of the church with my time and talent as a full-time missionary. As a mission partner, you will also be given the opportunity to serve CYSC in a unique and necessary way. Your partnership, no matter how great or small, helps to create an environment at camp that fosters faith and enkindles in the hearts of each camper the desire to "live the adventure" of their faith once they have gone from camp.

The mission of CYSC is so dear to my heart. People often ask me why I have given up my last two summers and plan to do it for another summer, and my response is always that it is worth it. Camp meant so much for me and my relationship with Christ when I attended in high school (and as I continue to attend) that I want to help create that same experience for other youth of the church. The mission of CYSC is alive, and greatly needed for the youth of our church. My prayer is that our Father will build His kingdom here on earth, as we live out our faith in service to Him.

In each bulletin this week is an envelope labeled for this mission. Within the envelope there is a slip of paper with a place for you to put your name and any special prayer intention. As a missionary, part of my work will consist of daily prayer. This summer I will be bringing to Christ in prayer not only campers, but also all of my consortium family. Please feel free to fill out this slip of paper regardless of whether or not you can support financially. The best way to get this envelope and prayer intention to me is by handing it to me personally, by dropping it off at the rectory, or by putting it in the collection basket at Mass.

If you have a camper of your own attending this 2017 summer, please contact me and let me know! I hope to see many Perry County youth joining me! If you do not have your own camper going this summer but still have questions or want to talk, please feel free to contact me as well. 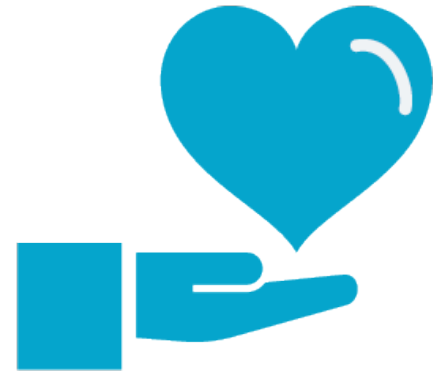
