Holy Week

Throughout the season of Lent, we have been preparing to enter deeply into the mysteries of Our Lord's Passion, Crucifixion, and Resurrection. During this time the Church has encouraged us to increase our prayer, to be more generous, and to fast and abstain both on the days of obligation and voluntarily. All of this is intended to draw us closer to Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior. As we begin Holy Week, we ought to increase our efforts all the more as we celebrate the greatest mysteries of the faith. In the celebrations of these mysteries, we are drawn into their reality. We sit with Our Lord as He celebrates the Last Supper with His Apostles, instituting the Eucharist and the priesthood. We walk with Our Lord to Calvary and gaze upon Him as He takes up His Cross and offers Himself for our sin on Good Friday. We reflect upon all the preparation of the Father with His Chosen People for the long awaited coming of Our Lord and we celebrate with exuberant joy Our Lord's Resurrection from the dead. He has conquered sin and death for us and at the Easter Vigil, we celebrate that moment when he throws open the gates of heaven that we may be with Him in perfect joy forever. This, of course, leads us into the celebration of Easter Sunday, Easter Week, and the Easter Season as we recall and experience again the Resurrection of Our Lord and all of the promise it entails for us.

Monday of Holy Week: Evening Prayer (Vespers) to be prayed at the Church of the Atonement at 7:00 p.m. in association with the Crooksville Ministerial Alliance. Music will be provided by both the Sounds of Faith Community Choir and the Church of the Atonement Choir.

Holy Thursday: The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at St. Rose Church at 7:00 p.m. This Mass commemorates the institution of the priesthood and the Eucharist. It also reminds us of the innate call of every Christian to be of service to one another. This liturgy begins the Easter Triduum, the most sacred time of the year. Here we go with Our Lord to the garden of Gethsemane. We have an opportunity to pray in silence with Our Lord in the garden as Our Lord says to us, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." We sit with Jesus in his most trying Hour. At 10:00 p.m. there will be a celebration of Night Prayer (Compline) over in the PCC at the Garden and in the presence of Our Lord.

Good Friday: We will offer Reconciliation at St. Rose from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. We will celebrate *The Passion of the Lord* at St. Rose at Noon, at St. Bernard and St. Patrick at 3:00 p.m., and at Church of the Atonement at 7:00 p.m. This celebration, though not a Mass, places us at the foot of Our Lord's Cross and asks us to be there with Him reflecting that it is on account of our sins that He makes His Sacrifice.

Holy Saturday: We will be offering reconciliation at St. Rose from 10:00 a.m. until Noon. *Easter Vigil*. We will celebrate the Easter Vigil at St. Rose at 8:30 p.m. This is the most sacred and most intense liturgy of the year. Here we see the culmination of the entire mystery of salvation, from the beginning of time. The Light of Christ enters the world and engulfs it in its eternal light. This celebration is the most special of the whole year. It also is the time traditionally to bring people into the Church. What a special moment, when we witness others receiving that light of Christ we already have. He is risen!!!

Easter Sunday: He is risen, indeed!!! Continuing the celebration from the night before, we will celebrate Easter Sunday at St. Rose at 7:30 am, Church of the Atonement and St. Patrick at 9:00 am, and St. Bernard and St. Rose at 10:30 am. We want to encourage you to come to all of these wonderful celebrations of the Mysteries of our faith. These are the highlights of Catholicism and connect us to Our Lord, His Ministry, His Mission, His Sacrifice, and His Resurrection like nothing else can.

We will be offering "Fulfilled" in the Lower Level of the Parish Community Center at St. Rose at 9:30 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. All are welcome Thursday, April 5 and 12.
