SCHOOL NEWS:**PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES/**

REPORT CARDS: You have had the opportunity to meet your child's teacher(s) and review your child's report card. The report card is an indicator of the progress your child is making in the curricular areas for his or her grade level. But it is also an indicator of the progress your child has made in responsibility and personal growth. Children are not born with a sense of their responsibility, rather, that is something that is developed. Teaching children to take care of themselves, their property, their behavior choices, their Catholic obligations and their homework takes time. However, your expectations on completing these tasks play a major impact on the success rate of your student. Teachers often tell me that a particular student would be more successful "if they would just do their homework." Homework is assigned to help reinforce the knowledge and information that students learn at school. Homework is assigned to help develop good study habits. Homework is assigned to each student to be responsible for completing a job or assignment on their own. Homework is important. Children who do not clean up their rooms, pick up their playthings when asked or complete their chores, are the same children who do not do their homework. You can stop this from happening by asking to see your child's completed work, limiting time on electronic devices and requiring specific time each night dedicated to reading. Homework--priceless!...Mrs. D.
