PARISH NEWS:

Last Sunday was our 5th session of Chosen: “Who is Jesus?” This lesson answered the fundamental question, while also addressing basic questions like: “Was Jesus real?” and, “Did He really claim to be God?” The person, nature, and work of Christ – from His Incarnation to His Second Coming – is at the center of the Catholic Faith. Christ is the model for how we are to live. He is the one who saves us from our sin and gives us the hope of eternal life. He is the fullness of revelation about God and is Himself God in the flesh. Jesus, then, is the only way to find lasting peace and freedom.

Our teenagers had a variety of responses to the question, “Who is Jesus?” Living in a post-Christian society, surrounded by a dizzying panorama of creeds and worldviews, students need to be challenged to remember the words of the Lord: “I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me” (John 14:6). Maybe share your responses to the following questions:

- 1.) How does the role of Jesus play in your life?
- 2.) Who would you die for right now, if anyone?
- 3.) How do you respond to God’s love in your daily life?
