OLD CATHOLIC CEMETERY GETS NEW SIGN AND CLEANUP: Chapel Hill Cemetery on Irish Ridge Road in Monroe Twp. received a new sign and a cleanup on November 2nd (All Souls Day). The sign was purchased by Dorothy Goebel and Larry Kent, descendants of the Weiner Family and dedicated on November 2nd with a short ceremony that was led by Mark Weiner, also a descendant who is participating in the Deacon's program of the Diocese of Columbus. The cleanup took place after the dedication. This cleanup and new sign have been a heartfelt desire of Mrs. Goebel's and has finally happened. The cemetery was the burial ground for the Catholic people in the area who were mainly members of the Chapel Hill or otherwise known as St. Francis Catholic Church that existed on the site just a few years up the road from the cemetery for the mid-1800's until the early 1900's. The earliest burial found in the records was of Mary Ann Masterson in 1840 and the last burial was Mary A. Haughran in 1953. Chapel Hill Cemetery and Church are very near the once booming coal-mining town of San Toy. The ancestors of the Weiner family are interred in Chapel Hill beginning with the earliest settler, Franz Weiner (1780-1865) who migrated here with his wife Catherine and four children from Bavaria, Germany in 1831. The Weiner family members participated in the dedication and cleanup. Harriett Weiner Densmore, the great-great-granddaughter of Franz, was in attendance; she is the oldest living member of that segment of the Weiner family. The Monroe Twp. Trustees strive to maintain the old cemetery by mowing.
