The tournament profited just over \$10,000.00, which provides funding for St. Rose athletic operations as well as a variety of school and parish projects. Families will attend Mass at 6:00 p.m. and then come over to the PCC hall for a potluck dinner, Irish music and children's games. 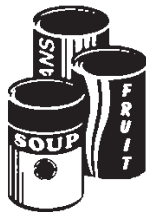
