The four-yearletter winner set an individual record this past season in the 100m breaststroke, with a time of 1:18.17. During his junior season, he was part of four relay teams that set school records. They were the 200 yard medley relay, the 200 meter medley relay, the 200 yard freestyle relay and the 200 meter freestyle relay. Schaumleffel finished third in the 100SC meter breaststroke and fifth in the 200 sc meter IM at the East Central Ohio League meet held in Coshocton. At this year's Muskingum County meet, he placed first in the 100m fly and 200m IM, and his 400 meter relay team took first place as well. At the sectional swim meet. Brendon finished sixth in the 200 meter IM, and eighth in the 100 yard breaststroke. Schaumleffel also competed in the district swim meet held at Ohio University in Athens. At that meet, he place eighth in the 50 meter freestyle and twenty-first in the 100 meter breaststroke. His 200 yard medley team placed eighteenth and his 200 yard freestyle relay team placed twenty-first. Brendon is an honor roll student at RHS and is the son of J.C. and Carol Schaumleffel of Corning.
