### SCHOOL NEWS, FROM MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:

At recent meetings in Columbus, I was given tons of good information and many tasks to complete. I am very impressed with the efforts of the diocese educational staff. They are working extremely hard to help us. Keep in mind they are dealing with forty-eight elementary schools and eleven high schools. Teachers will report to school on August 18th and 19th for in-services. On Wednesday, August 19th at 7:00 p.m., we will all meet at the church for a brief parent/guardian meeting. I will introduce the staff and share a few thoughts with you. Fr. Jim will also address you at that time. When we are finished, please take a few minutes to visit the school and see what changes have been made over the summer. School will begin on Thursday, August 20th. We will celebrate our first school Mass together on Friday, August 21st at 9:00 a.m. The Crooksville and New Lexington buses will be dropping off students at approximately 8:25-8:30 a.m. Instruction will begin at 8:45 a.m. and conclude at 3:25 p.m. The Crooksville and New Lexington buses will be leaving St. Rose about 3:15 each afternoon. I have scheduled a meeting with Katrina Carpenter of Perry County Litter Control. I intended to use Pope Francis' ideas about being stewards of our planet to help Mrs. Carpenter in her local efforts. I will also be meeting with the new director of Stanton Villa to organize our efforts to use the Corporal Works of Mercy to help out the women living there. At some point next week, Ms. Smith and Mrs. Dodd will assist me in organizing the library and establishing a schedule. Also, Mrs. Haggengos has agreed to help us with music again this year. We will be meeting to discuss the Christmas program and the music program in general. In late September, we will be organizing the Home and School Association and the Educational Committee. You may notice that the volunteers mentioned above do not

have children at St. Rose, and yet they want to help us become the best version of St. Rose that we can be. I am grateful once again for the community's willingness to help us. In his book "*Rediscover Catholicism*," Matthew Kelly writes: "Prayer is central to the Christian experience. Growing in character and virtue, learning to hear the voice of God in our lives and walking where he calls us, all require the discipline of prayer. And it is not enough to pray when we feel like it. Prayer requires a daily commitment." That same sentiment is echoed by David Booth in the Book "*Toward the Goal*," which is a book about hockey players who have embraced Christianity. Booth states: "I mess up every day with the sins I struggle with, so I'm not one to judge. That's where prayer comes in. That's really the only way through it, along with having a good support system."
