School News, from Mr. Medaugh, Principal:

St. Rose School website: www.stroselimaschool.org. I met with Katrina Carpenter from the Perry County Litter prevention and mapped out activities for the entire year. I met with Mrs. Haggengos and got her thoughts about our music program and roughed out the Christmas program. I have talked to Judy Smith about the Education Commission Committee and the first meeting is scheduled for September 21st. Home and School will be organized shortly. I have been contacting contractors about replacement of some exterior doors and I will be trying to get grants from the Catholic Foundation for that project. I also want to take steps to keep our students and staff safe during drills and emergencies. I was made aware of a \$2,000 grant to fund communication systems and have started working on that. At this point, I am working with several agencies and countless departments at the diocese. I can't believe how eager people are to help us succeed. I am encouraged and I am excited about what potentially can happen here at St. Rose. I really don't have any profound insights this week. I'm pretty drained at this point. I did hear loud and clear the first reading from 1 Kings a few Sundays back "Elijah went a day's journey into the desert, until he came to a broom tree and sat beneath it. He prayed for death saying: "This is enough, O LORD!" But as you know an angel revived Elijah twice and he went about his business. I couldn't help but think two thoughts: First "What aren't you getting here, Lord? I'm tired and I'm done. The 'Do Not Disturb Sign' is up Go away." The second thought that occurred to me, is "Either God can't read or his plan trumps all others." Of course we all know that the *real* message is that God will feed our bodies and our souls. Especially, when we need it most. That's handy information right there.

CAFETERIA: We have not had an increase in prices for several years. After an audit, it was recommended that our prices be increased to begin to offset our breakfast and lunch program costs. As mentioned in Mr. Medaugh's *Looking Ahead*, breakfast this year will be \$1.25 and Lunch \$2.25. The first day parent packet will include information and an application for the National Free and Reduced Lunch Program.
