SCHOOL NEWS, FROM:**MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:**

School Speak was rolled out, and you should have received an e-mail giving you a username and password. You should be able to view only your child's attendance and grade book. As the teachers become more familiar with the system, you will be able to view homework assignments, newsletters, e-mails, etc.

If you find that you are getting information to which you are not entitled, please let Mr. Medaugh know. You should only be able to view information that is pertinent to *your* family and *your* child.

I also want to point out that the grade book will not be updated instantaneously. Your child's Friday afternoon spelling test will not magically appear by 4:00 p.m. that

afternoon unless the teacher puts that information into the system. I am going to trust the teachers' judgment on how quickly grades appear. I will address issues on an individual basis, if any occur. The thing about teaching, especially in the younger grades, the teacher is always "on." One thing I found out very quickly when I switched from seventh and eighth grade literature to first grade is that you can't just tell a six-year-old to read a story and then write five questions about it. Also, teachers go home to be husbands and wives and have family duties to attend to. Try to keep these things in mind as you check the grade book.

It is possible to edit all information in School Speak. If you notice an error, let us know and we will review the information and correct it.

All three buses pick our students up in front of the school at 3:15 p.m. We are putting together our student bus list. Please notify our office about your child's transportation needs if you have not done so. It is also helpful to let the office know by 2:30 p.m. when there is a change in you child's transportation. Be aware that if your child rides the bus and we do not receive a call or a note that there is a change before the buses pull out, your child will be put on the bus.

We are in the process of compiling volunteer hours. If you were an event leader, please submit those hours. It is not my intention to shortchange anyone, so if you worked helping move furniture or whatever, let us know. I am grateful for your volunteered time and I think you all should get credit for it.

I will be meeting with the treasurer from New Lexington City Schools and Mrs. Medaugh and I will be attending a grant writing workshop for the Catholic Foundation in Columbus.

In his book *Rediscover Catholicism*, Matthew Kelly writes about daily prayer in Chapter 13. "Prayer is central to the Christian experience. A Christian life is not sustainable without it, because growth in the Christian life is simply not possible without prayer. Growing in character, and virtue, learning to hear the voice of God in our lives and walking where he calls us – all require the discipline of prayer. And it is not enough to simply pray when we feel like it. Prayer requires a daily commitment."
