## SCHOOL NEWS, FROM MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:

I attended a meeting with other first-year principals and we worked on marketing our schools. I also met with the Education Commission. This board is an advisory board and a group of people that I rely on. The committee needs to be honest, resourceful, and committed to advancing the Catholic Faith at St. Rose Catholic School. The members who came to the meeting are all of those things and more. I am looking forward to working with them.

The magazine sale has started. You can shop online at [www.gaschoolstore.com](http://www.gaschoolstore.com). There is a link on our school website. Our school ID number is 2669919; goal is \$6,000.00 and the money will be used to bolster our technology equipment.

I will be attending an LPDC meeting in Columbus. I have belonged to this committee for several years. It is a group of teachers and school administrators who get together to check the credentials of teachers in the diocese and help them renew their license.

If you hear that we are consolidating with Holy Trinity, it is **not** true. We are all smart enough to know that it would be impractical. What I can tell you is that we intend to work with Holy Trinity to create a more unified approach to Catholic Education in Perry County. We certainly can do service projects together. We can worship together. We can promote our schools together. We can socialize together. It is pretty impressive when you consider between the two campuses we have over 200 students. So the short of it is, we are going to work together to promote Catholic education in Perry County and we are not going to consolidate.

Karie Cook and I have started working on grants. We are working on a grant through The Raskob Foundation for Catholic Activities. This can be a substantial grant to help us with our larger capital improvements projects. We are also working on a grant through South Central Power that would allow us to purchase equipment for art, physical education and music.

I have submitted an application to the Catholic Foundation that will cover all or most of the cost of replacing the back three doors of the school. I have two other grants pending through Ohio Schools Facilities Commission: one for an emergency communications system and one for an improved door monitoring system.

October is Rosary Month for us at St. Rose and we will be reciting the Rosary every Thursday at 2:30 p.m. In the church. My favorite set of mysteries is the Sorrowful Mysteries.

John Phalen, C.S.C., wrote a book called *Living the Rosary, Finding Your Life in the Mysteries*. In it he writes, "Suffering is always worse when your loved ones, standing around you, really are unaware of its severity." He continues, "The challenge is to be more Good Samaritan than sleeping apostle when it comes to accompany another in his or her sufferings."

**AMAZING ALUMNI:** St. Rose Graduates continue to make their marks at Fisher Catholic High School in Lancaster.

Taylor Thompson is a senior tennis player at the Catholic school. She has lettered in tennis three times and is busy completing her senior requirements and spent the last summer visiting colleges. Taylor graduated from St. Rose in 2012.

John Bowen-Kunkler graduated from St. Rose in 2013 and is a junior at Fisher. This is his first try at football. John plays on all the kicking teams for the Irish who are currently 3-2. He also plays wide receiver and defensive back. John plays baseball in the spring and plays basketball during the winter.

Michael Mooney, also a junior, is in the band for the third time. He was able to stick with the sousaphone this year and has helped the band grow from about eleven members to about twenty. The band has participated in parades and took the football field for the first time at a home game with Millersport.

Elizabeth Vigue is a freshman at FCHS having graduated from St. Rose last spring. She is completing her first year of tennis. Elizabeth won a spot on the school quiz team and will participate on it once the tennis season is completed.

Another freshman, Sarah Mooney is breaking records on the cross-country team.

"I continue to believe that St. Rose School helps give its students the courage to try new things. I am amazed at the activities our former students try. We do not have a tennis team, cross-country team, a band, or quiz team here and we have former students in these activities. And, even though John's football experience is limited, he has decided to work at something new."

**RARE TREAT:** Students in Mr. Ewing's and Mrs. Reed's classes had the rare treat of observing an intact horseshoe crab recently. The nine-inch crab was found on the beach at Rodanthe, North Carolina. Emmy and Bodie Decore were vacationing with their family when the crab was discovered.
