Hats off to the students who represented St. Rose School on the Home and School Association-sponsored float in the New Lexington H.S. Homecoming parade. Thanks to the Home and School officers who coordinated the parade event, and to the parents who walked with their children in the parade. Thanks also to Home and School who provided dinner for our teachers on conference nights.

Attention, all 8th graders and their families. The 8th Grade will be cleaning the PCC, upper level after the Toys for Tots event. Cleanup will **begin Sunday, November 8th at 9:45 a.m.** This is a fundraiser for the 8th grade class trip. If you have any questions, call Jeanette Compston.

This year Mr. Medaugh signed up *all* grades, not just the upper grades, to take part in Book Jackets created by the Blue Jackets Hockey franchise and powered by ARP, as an incentive for our students to learn to love reading. All the student has to do is write the number of minutes he/she reads each day and then color in the ice rink on the Blue Jacket card as reading goals are met. There are established numbers of minute goals a student has to meet but the rewards are fantastic!

Five boys from St. Rose Catholic School helped form the Holy Rose football team with the boys from Holy Trinity. The team finished the season with a 2-4-0 record. They placed fifth in the CYO Varsity Eagle Division. The squad opened the season with two losses. The first to St. Brendan (2-3-1) 6-12 and second to undefeated St. Pius 2-6. Holy Rose then defeated winless Western Irish 36-0. Two more losses followed. St. Matthew (4-2-0) defeated the team 23-0 and St. Paul (3-2-1) beat the squad in a tight 6-12 contest. Dalton Proctor was a two-way lineman who is in the 8th grade. Nick Losco was a running back and a safety and is in 8th grade. Thomas Spohn was a receiver and safety. Thomas is in 7th grade. Two injured players were Cam Hay who was the starting quarterback injured in the St. Matthew game and Jesse Kunkler who missed the first 5 games with a broken wrist. Both of these boys are in the 8th grade.

St. Rose will be closed on November 12th and 13th as the staff will be attending the OCEA Convention. The 6th, 7th and 8th grades will be attending a visitation day at Bishop Rosecrans on November 3rd.

OHIO BALLOT ISSUES: In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue and participation in political life is a moral obligation. Political rights are meant to be exercised for the common good of the nation and the human community. There are three statewide issues on the November 3rd ballot.

Issue 1: A legislatively initiated redistricting amendment creating a bipartisan process for drawing legislative districts.

Issue 2: A legislatively initiated anti-monopoly amendment prohibiting any petitioner from placing in the Ohio Constitution provisions that provide exclusive personal economic benefits.

Catholic Bishops of Ohio have taken a supportive position on issue 1 and Issue 2.

Issue 3: A voter-initiated marijuana amendment that legalizes marijuana for medicinal and personal use in Ohio.

Catholic Bishops of Ohio oppose Issue 3, and urge a **NO** vote.
