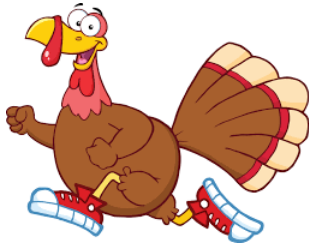

FUNERAL PLANS: November is a great month to ponder the last things. As we have celebrated All Saints and prayed for All Souls, we are also confronted with our own mortality. Are your affairs in order? Do you have a will? Do you have a Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care Decisions? Have you informed your family of your wishes to have a funeral Mass? 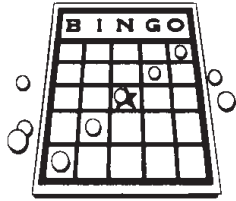
