## POPE FRANCIS:

LET US BE LIGHTS OF HOPE! It is true that nowadays, to some extent, everyone, including our young people, feel attracted by the many idols which take the place of God and appear to offer hope: money, success, power, pleasure. Often a growing sense of loneliness and emptiness in the hearts of many people and it leads them to seek satisfaction in these ephemeral idols. Dear brothers and sisters, let us be lights of hope! Let us maintain a positive outlook on reality. Let us encourage the generosity, which is typical of the young and help them to work actively in building a better world. Young people are a powerful engine for the Church and for society. They do not need material things alone; also and above all, they need to have held up to them those nonmaterial values which are the spiritual heart of a people, the memory of a people. Those values of: spirituality, generosity, solidarity, perseverance, fraternity, joy; they are values whose deepest root is in the Christian faith.

Saint Mary Magdalene...The Gospels tell us that Mary Magdalene was one from whom "seven demons had gone out" (Lk. 8:2). She came to Jesus in her brokenness. Overwhelmed with the desire for something to change, she asked Him to heal her and He did. From that time, Mary followed Him anywhere and everywhere. She stood with the other women at the foot of the cross. And on the morning after the Sabbath, she stood outside the tomb weeping (Jn. 20:11-16). There she met the gardener. "Woman, why are you weeping?" Sick with grief, Mary said, "Sir, if you carried him away, tell me where you laid him, and I will take him" At this, the "gardener" addressed her, "Mary!"

All at once, she knew that it was Jesus. The one who healed her and conquered death itself. And, He called her by name! She was overwhelmed with His love. Meditating upon Mary Magdalene, Pope Benedict XVI taught: "If we seek the Lord with a simple and sincere mind, we too will find him; indeed, he himself will come to meet us; he will make us recognize him, he will call us by name...he will admit us to the intimacy of his love."

**ST. PEREGRINE:** Patron Saint of Cancer Patients – In 2010, Bishop Fredrick Campbell and The Diocesan Council of Catholic Women launched a cancer response initiative – Catholic for Cancer Prevention and Cure. In 2016, this initiative was renamed the St. Peregrine Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide resources for cancer screening, ethical research, and outreach to individuals and families dealing with all forms of cancer. In Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium* (The Joy of the Gospel), we are called to respond to the Gospel, to live it more fully and more deeply, to reach out to the poor and broken, to end injustice, to build peace. And to find the joy in all of it.
