ST. ROSE SCHOOL NEWS:

The start of the 2016-2017 St. Rose School Year is Friday, August 19th. As of this writing, there are 87 students enrolled in St. Rose School for the 2016-2017 school year.

Also, as of this writing, there is a total of \$14,781.00 in unpaid tuition from last school year.

Grant applications for replacing all the St. Rose School Windows is in progress.

Plans are in the discussion/estimation stage to replace the front and back school doors.

The St. Rose Home and School Association hosted the sponsored “Back-to-School Splash” Pool Party to kick off the school year. It was held at the New Lexington Municipal Swimming Pool in Arethusa Springs Park, New Lexington. The event ran from 6:00-8:00 p.m. Drinks and snacks were provided.

ECO-TIPS: What do you do with old eyeglasses? In 1925, Helen Keller addressed the Lions Clubs Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio. She challenged Lions to become “knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness.” Since then, Lions have worked tirelessly to aid the blind and visually impaired. Prescription glasses are not legally able to be reused and distributed to U.S. citizens because of our prescription laws. Most Lions glasses go to developing countries, like Africa and South America. Rob Ogden, New Lexington Lions President, stated our area Lions District (18-20 counties) sent 50,000 pairs of *reused* glasses to help others in 2015!
