POPE FRANCIS:

Evangelization Begins in the Home...The work of evangelization begins in the home...Moreover, the Church's love for the pastoral solicitude towards the family is at the heart of the new evangelization. By promoting prayer, marital fidelity, monogamy, purity, and humble service of one another within families, the Church continues to make an invaluable contribution..., one which, coupled with her educational and healthcare apostolates, will surely foster greater stability and progress in our country. There is scarcely a finer service which the Church can offer than to give witness to our conviction of the sanctity of God's gift or life and to the essential role played by spiritual and stable families in preparing the younger generations to live virtuous lives and to face the challenges of the future with wisdom, courage, and generosity.

"EPHPHATHA!" (Mk 7:34) We open doors and cans and windows and stores, but Jesus alone opens us. When he speaks his command to the deaf man, "*Be opened!*" he unlocks the poor man's prison of silence. The first words the deaf man hears are the words of the Word. Magnificent! The creating Word rings through the air and shatters the awful stillness; a man alien to music, to the song and sounds of nature, a man sealed in solitude, is inwardly touched by a mysterious power. A new dimension and world suddenly open up before him.

In the Book of Amos, the Lord forecasts a coming famine: "*Not a famine of bread, or thirst for water, but for hearing the word of the Lord*" (Amos 8:11). In sin the world is robbed of its hearing. God in heaven seems to sit in unsearchable silence. When he speaks his Word, the Lord tears open the iron heavens, like the sweet mercy of rain showers falling after a drought. To outsiders, God's Word, in Scripture and the Tradition of the Church, is merely lips moving without any music or meaning. To those opened, however, a new sense is awakened in the hearing of faith.

Plans are in the discussion/estimation stage to replace the front and back school doors.

Some families, however, need more financial assistance. The tuition rate for the 2016-2017 school year will be approximately \$2,150.00 per student. The total cost to educate each student is approximately \$4,650.00 per year. The faithful who enroll in Masonic associations are in state of grave sin and may not receive Holy Communion.” In light of this, we fervently encourage all who are members of Masonic Associations to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and return to a zealous, lively, and life-giving practice of the faith.
