SUMMARY OF THE ST. ROSE TOWNHALL MEETING:

By way of introduction, Father Noble emphasized that the Town Hall Meetings are understood as the first step in a long term discussion of the needs and dreams of the Perry County Consortium of Catholic Parishes. Father Noble brought the following items to the discussion:

- Because of the degeneration of the foundation of the rectory of St. Rose, it is projected to collapse within the next 1-3 years.
- A brief financial summary of the fiscal year 2015-2016.
- The call to prepare for the celebration of 150 years as a parish at St. Rose
- Parish renewal models such as Amazing Parish and Christ Renews His Parish
- Air conditioning St. Rose Church
- Developing a common understanding of “consortium of parishes”

The meeting was attended by about forty people and they brought up the following items for discussion

- A better PA system for the church
- A “recommissioning” of a system of parish councils/finance/liturgy committees
- Greater financial accountability for parish and program funds
- Adult faith formation programs
- Landscaping the front of the church
- Music at 7:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays
- Air conditioning the school
- Announcement that new leadership must be found for the Parish Festival, with the proposal that the possibility of combining the four parish Festivals into one “consortium” Festival be investigated

- The need to recognize the value of volunteers, how they should be treated with respect, how the burden must be shared by many so that the few don’t quit from exhaustion
- The call to consciously work at connecting with our college-age and young adult parishioners
- The greater use and development of endowment funds to support the school (watch for the announcement of a meeting in October to address this)
- Review the parish CCD Program
- Review the use of the parish PCC and establish policies governing its use.
- A good deal of discussion focused on recognizing and embracing the important role and contribution made to the life of the parish and community by St. Rose School.

In the course of the meeting, Father Noble announced that the natural “next” step, once the town hall meetings are completed, would be the implementation of a “self-study” process to prioritize and evaluate the possibility of implementing the various ideas and proposals. He emphasized the importance of volunteers participating in the self-study process so that any and all proposals truly reflect the heart and mind of the parishes/consortium as we move forward.
