ST. ROSE SCHOOL NEWS:

Ed Choice Expansion Scholarship students – Once you receive information, via U.S. mail, that you have been awarded a scholarship, please bring your Acceptance Award to the St. Rose School Office. St. Rose is required to scan and upload the award letter, so the scholarship can be credited to your child’s tuition.

Children’s Rights to Special Education Services – It is a Federal and State Law that “Each school district is required to provide equitable services and participation for eligible children who are attending a chartered or non-chartered non-public school located within the district’s geographical boundaries.” In other words, if you have a child with special needs at St. Rose, they receive special education services by law.

St. Rose School will NOT be attending the Quad Mass on Friday, October 7th at Zanesville, St. Nicholas Church.

There will be no school on Friday, September 30th, for students but Teachers will report to St. Rose School for Professional Development (PD). This is a change in what the school calendar says.
