TOWN HALL SUMMARIES:

Summary of the Town Hall Meeting at St. Bernard – September 1, 2016

Father Noble introduced the meeting with remarks similar to the town hall meeting at St. Rose. The meeting was attended by 13 parishioners. Concerns focused on the following areas:

- The need for a CCD program and a program of youth ministry
- The need for a finance committee
- The need for a parish council or some form of local representative leadership
- The question of not having a parish festival this year
- The suggestion of a Consortium Parish Festival
- The need for a program of outreach to those who have fallen away from the practice of the faith
- The celebration of Holy Day Masses and Holy Week services
- The need for emergency communication in the church (a phone)
- The need for a sharing of the cleaning duties for the church
- The suggestion to sell the organ in the church and the potbelly stove in the St. Vincent De Paul building
- The need for a better PA system in the church
- The need for a review of the building utilization at St. Bernard

Summary of the Town Hall Meeting at Church of the Atonement—September 8, 2016

Father Noble introduced the meeting with remarks similar to the town hall meeting at St. Rose. The meeting was attended by 12 parishioners. Concerns focused on the following areas:

- The suggestion to rotate Holy Day celebrations
- The suggestion for rotating “daily” Mass
- The importance of helping parishioners feel connected to the parish via get-well cards and thank you cards
- The suggestion of a mailing campaign to express concern and to encourage Mass attendance
- The need for a finance committee
- The role of the Festival in the life of the parish
- The suggestion of a Consortium Parish Festival
- The concern for the diminishing CCD program and a program for the youth of the parish
- The suggestion for an adult scripture study program
- The concern regarding the relationship between the community of Church of the Atonement and the Ecumenical group that meets in Crooksville

Summary of the Town Hall Meeting at St. Patrick – September 15, 2016

Father Noble introduced the meeting with remarks similar to the town hall meeting at St. Rose. The meeting was attended by 31 parishioners. Concerns focused on the following areas:

- The need for a finance committee and some form of local, representative leadership
- The need to replace or refurbish the outdoor Blessed Virgin Mary statue
- The celebration of local Holy Day Masses and Holy Week services
- The suggestion for more opportunities for Confessions at St. Patrick
- The suggestion to establish a relationship with missionary work or a “sister” church in the missions
- The importance of a lively and vital youth ministry program
- The suggestion of celebrating infant Baptisms during Mass
- The importance of “priestly presence” in St. Rose School and the Catholic high schools
- The suggestion for an adult scripture study program
- The need for training of those serving at Mass: Altar Servers, Eucharistic Ministers and Readers
- The discussion of a Consortium Parish Festival
- The need for a better PA system in the church

- The discussion of the fair booth, the numbers of hours contributed, and the total dollars raised for the school
- The need for outreach to parishioners that have fallen away from the practice of the faith, especially in those communities of the county that have lost their churches
- The suggestion of building a “simple three-bedroom home” and offering it as a residence of a newly retired priest
- As in the meeting at St. Rose, Father Noble announced in each of the above three meetings that the natural “next” step would be the implementation of a “self-study” process to prioritize and evaluate the possibility of implementing the various ideas and proposals. He emphasized the importance of volunteers participating in the self-study process, so that any and all proposals truly reflect the heart and mind of the parishes/consortium as we move forward.

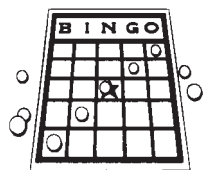


ANNOUNCING THE 2016 PUBLIC SQUARE ROSARY CRUSADE:

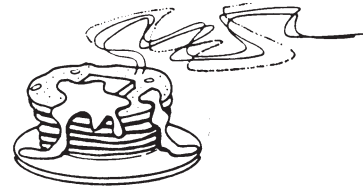
