December 2nd, the 3rd Luncheon at St. Rose School had a great attendance and was well-liked by grandparents, parents and family. Thanks to the families who will host the NET Ministries Retreat members on December 7th. The retreat will be in the lower level of the PCC from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., for 6th, 7th and 8th graders.

December 15th St. Rose School Christmas Program will begin from 6:00 p.m. until 6:40 p.m. *It may seem early, but Kindergarten registration is only a few months away. Please consider St. Rose for Kindergarten, if you have not considered it. Please contact the school if you would like additional information. *Pre-School Planning and preparation continues for pre-school at St. Rose for the fall of 2017. Hours and days of operation are still in the discussion stage. Tuition is also still in the discussion stage. 24 of the pre-school surveys have been returned and there are eight children/families showing definite interest. *Enrollment – 84 students is the current enrollment. Increasing enrollment is an ongoing goal. Why make the sacrifice to send your child to St. Rose? According to the Diocese Marketing Consultant this question is best answered by talking with parents who have children currently enrolled at St. Rose School. One answer to this question is St. Rose offers a Catholic faith-based education where God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit are present and school prayer is permitted.

*Tuition collection letters were mailed out November 15th. This is the first of many attempts to collect a total of \$20,747 from seven families for the 2014-2015 and a total of 2015-2016 school year. Letters were mailed to three families who have yet to make arrangements for payments for a total of \$6,275.00 for 2016-2017 tuition. Please call St. Rose School if you owe tuition. We will work with you to work out a fair, reasonable payment plan. These are the figures we have from the FACTS tuition management system.

*There have been numerous requests made over the last 20 years by St. Rose School personnel to the New Lexington Village Council for Speed Limit Signs indicating "School Zone." If any parishioner has pull with the Village of New Lexington to push for this request it would be greatly appreciated. This is for the safety of the students and staff.
