THE CURRENT STATUS OF ST. ROSE RECTORY:

We did receive a second opinion. The “Basement Doctor” from Columbus came and assessed the rectory’s foundation. His opinion concurred with the first assessment:

- The foundation will fail within one to three years
- The cost of repairing the foundation is prohibitive

Please know we will not make any hasty or rash decision in this regard. As we form the new “buildings and grounds” committee, with the help of the parish survey, we will again review the situation and with their counsel develop a strategy for the “next best steps” for the use of the rectory.

*Security Cameras Installed – The Ohio School Facilities commission (OFC) awarded St. Rose School a \$5,000.00 Grant for security cameras. Mid-Ohio Integrated Systems, Caldwell, OH, installed four security cameras. The cameras are connected to the computer monitors in the school office. Using the computer mouse the cameras can be zoomed in/out, records the rotated 360 degrees. The cameras offer surveillance of all sides of the school.

*Preschool – Planning and preparation continues for preschool at St. Rose School in the fall of 2017. No additional preschool surveys have been received in addition to the 24 reported in an earlier bulletin with eight families indicating interest. A prerequisite of opening a preschool is a Fire Inspection. One has been scheduled for December 27th.

*Enrolment – 84 students is the current enrollment of St. Rose School. Increasing enrollment remains an ongoing goal. The Baptism Records of the Consortium Parishes for roughly the last five years is a good indicator of future enrollment. More babies results in more students.

*Tuition Collection – There was one response from the first Tuition Collection Letters mailed last month. Second Tuition Collection letters were mailed out Tuesday, December 15th. This is the first of many attempts to collect from seven families who owe a total of \$20,747.00 for the 2014-2015 and 2015-16 school years. Second letters were mailed to three families who have yet to make arrangements for payments for a total of \$6,275.00 for 2016-2017 tuition.
