FACE FORWARD LAUNCHES MOBILE APP: Mobile App Brings Understanding to the Catholic Faith. Developed for the Vocations Office of the Columbus Diocese (Our Pastor, Fr. Paul Noble, is Director). This free app contains valuable information for Catholics right at their fingertips. The Face Forward mobile app includes features, such as the Verse of the Day, Pray for Priests, Care for the Common Home, Saint of the Day and the Face Forward Blog, recognizing the importance of being able to reach young Catholics where they are, and that place is on their mobile devices. Seventy-three percent of kids between the ages of 5-19 are connected within an hour of waking up. Face Forward wanted to give them something meaningful to read when they powered up.

Fr. Noble says *“Face Forward enables us to provide young people a place online where they can explore questions about their life vocation, and what they are hoping to do with their life. The creation of this app makes it available right from their mobile device.”* Discerning a vocation and what God is calling you to do can be a long journey full of many questions.
