St. Rose School Information

- Thank you very much Mr. & Mrs. Larry and Susan Saffell and Lamb's Laundry for cleaning the St. Rose caps and gowns.
 - St. Rose School (SRS) received notice on May 10th that we were not awarded a grant to replace the school windows from the Raskob Foundation. We will continue to search for grants to replace the school windows.
 - St. Rose Preschool will open this August if we get enough applicants. Currently, there are five applications. To open a preschool, we need more students. We pray for more preschool students. Two preschool teachers are in the process of being hired and both come very highly recommended. Preschool applications can be picked up at the SRS Office. In order to be approved for a preschool license, we must put up a fence around the playground equipment on the High Street side of the playground. Estimates are being taken. Also, to meet licensing requirements for preschool, the gravel underneath the playground equipment must be removed and replaced with either 12 inches of mulch or shredded recycled tires. Any parishioner with information as to who to contact in order accomplish these tasks, please call the school office.
 - Congratulations and Best Wishes to our four graduating 8th Graders: Maeve Boley, Abigail Krile, Paiton McMillan and Thomas Spohn. May God continue to be the center of your lives.
 - Enrollments – SRS will lose four students through graduation. Next year's Kindergarten class, at present, has 10 with possibly two more. The numbers in grades 2 through 8 for next school year will remain the same except for four students who may withdraw. The estimated minimum enrollment for St. Rose School to sustain itself is 91 students.
 - SRS will lose another wonderful Title I Reading Teacher and Service Plan Teacher. Mrs. Lillie Rockwell is needed to care for a family member. Mrs. Rockwell will be missed. She is an outstanding, dedicated Teacher. We pray for her and extend our thanks as she moves to her new endeavor.
 - Tuition/Tuition Assistance – A number of parents have inquired as to whether there will be tuition assistance for the 2017-2018 school year, and the answer is "yes." We ask for your patience as we are working on tuition assistance and awaiting the announcement from the Office of EdChoice Expansion Scholarships as to what and how much the 40 families who applied in the first application window will be awarded. If you need tuition assistance, please contact Mike Lollo at the school office.
 - If you are a parent and member of one of the parishes of the Perry County Consortium of Catholic Parishes and have a school-age child or children, and you are not sending them to St. Rose School, why? If we don't know why, then we cannot address and fix the issue. It would greatly help St. Rose School if you would let us know why you choose not to send your child/children to St. Rose School. Please pray about this and "be not afraid" to tell us.
