From the Desk of the Administrator

Dear Parishioners,

I would like to take this opportunity to offer a warm welcome to our new Associate Administrator, Fr. Daniel Swartz. Fr. Swartz was ordained last year and comes to us from St. Matthew in Gahanna. He will be with us for the next two years before going to the United States Navy for service as a chaplain. Fr. Swartz is an exemplary priest and will be a great boon to our communities.

I would also like to make just a few remarks on my recent assignment as the Administrator for the Consortium parishes. I am deeply honored and gratified that Bishop Campbell has decided to make me the Administrator of our parishes. I see the work of the Holy Spirit in his decision and I look forward to working with all of you in building up the faith we have received from Jesus Christ and handed down to us by His Apostles. It is a great blessing to be here and to have the opportunity to serve all of you.

To serve you better, I would like to get to know you better. I would like to meet with each of your families. While I am not sure how long it will take to get to everyone, my hope is to meet with all our registered families over the course of three years. Starting in September, the office will be calling to make appointments to meet with families in their homes. The goal of these meetings will be so that I can know the people whom I serve in a better way. I would like to speak with each of you as to your faith and where you are in your journey with Christ. Additionally, I would also like to hear your story and learn if there is anything you need from your parish and how I can help. I would like to have these meetings either on Friday afternoons and evenings or Sunday afternoons. It is my hope that most people will find these times convenient. If you are unable to meet during these times, I will be happy to find another time to meet.

Listening to some of the desires of various parishioners I have heard so far, there seems to be a need for more access to the Sacraments. Therefore, beginning this September, I am happy to announce additions to the schedule that I think we might try for the next year. First, we are going to add a Mass at St. Rose on Saturday mornings at 10:00 a.m. Additionally, we are going to offer Mass at noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays, rotating weekly among Church of the Atonement, St. Bernard, and St. Patrick parishes. With the addition of these Masses, there will be a Holy Hour at the parish hosting the noon Masses that week. The Holy Hour will be on Tuesday from 5:15 to 6:15 p.m.

In addition to the increase in the Mass schedule, we would like to increase the opportunity for Confession throughout the Consortium. To accomplish this, we will be offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation before every weekday Mass, in addition to the weekend Confessions we already offer. Confessions will begin thirty-five minutes before each weekday Mass and conclude fifteen minutes before the beginning of each Mass, allowing for adequate time to prepare for Mass. In addition to the Confessions offered before each Mass, we will offer Reconciliation during each Holy Hour. This will include the Holy Hour currently at St. Rose, as well as the new Holy Hours at Church of the Atonement, St. Bernard, and St. Patrick.

With these additions to the schedule, it would be an excellent goal for our communities to make Holy Communion accessible to all our homebound on a weekly basis. While this will certainly be a challenge, it is one that, with some effort and generosity, we can meet. We need volunteers to give of their time to this important and rewarding apostolate. For those interested in becoming Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, we

will be hosting several training sessions in September. More information will be forthcoming about this excellent opportunity to serve our community.

Finally, I would like to invite your insights, questions, and comments on what we need in our communities. If you have a concern, issue, or just want to talk, I am always happy to meet, so that I may learn how to better serve you. Please, call the office at 740-342-1348 to schedule a meeting.

WELCOME: To Fr. Daniel Swartz, our new Associate Administrator!! Fr. Swartz is a native of Upper Arlington in Columbus. He attended St. Agatha School and later went on to high school at Bishop Watterson. Upon graduation he played soccer and studied at St. Vincent College in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, where he earned bachelor degrees in theology, political science, and philosophy, as well as minoring in Latin. Also during his time in college Fr. Swartz spent more than a year doing missionary work in Scotland, England, Germany, France, Italy, Slovenia, Belgium, and India; additionally, to take a break from all of that, he walked across all of Spain on foot.

Fr. Swartz's seminary studies were completed at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, and he was ordained a priest on May 27, 2016 by Bishop Campbell. He was assigned as a deacon at his home parish of St. Agatha and served his first year of priesthood at St. Matthew the Apostle in Gahanna. Fr. Swartz is also an officer in the US Navy and Marine Corps as a chaplain; he is set to deploy with them on active duty in several years time; he has been previously stationed on bases in Norfolk, Virginia and Newport, Rhode Island.

Fr. Swartz is very excited to start in his new assignment assisting Fr. Haddad in Perry County. Some information of note; he is an avid soccer player, enjoys a good game of hockey, is a backpacking trail guide, has a taste for yogurt, caramel, and pizza, is quite skilled with a paintball gun, and possesses a great devotion to St. Joseph.

THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL FOR STUDENTS(K-8) – St. Rose School began its 105th consecutive year of operation on Friday, August 18th. The school day begins at 8:30 a.m. Students may be dropped off at the Cafeteria(PCC) at 7:45 a.m. or on the playground at 8:15 a.m. The school day ends at 3:25 p.m. Cars may pull on the playground at 3:25 p.m.

ST. ROSE PRESCHOOL – St. Rose will begin its first-ever Preschool on Monday, August 28th. Preschool hours are the same as the regular school hours (8:15 a.m.-3:25 p.m.) Preschool Rates are as follows: \$20.00/day for 5 days, \$22.00/day for 4 days, \$23.00/day for 3 days, \$24.00/day for 2 days. Preschool fees must be paid in advance biweekly. There is no tuition assistance for preschool. Preschool tuition can be paid at the St. Rose School Office.

Tuition – Tuition Rates for the 2017-2018 school year for K-8 are as follows: 1st Child – \$2,250, 2nd Child – \$2,150.00, 3 or more Children – \$2,050.00, and for non-Catholics is \$2,950.00 per Child.

Tuition Assistance – Tuition Assistance is available. Please note that we are currently revamping the tuition assistance process. The earlier you request tuition assistance the better.

Please keep St. Rose School in your prayers. It's a special place and a place where evangelization will continue to happen.

SOLAR ECLIPSE: On August 21st a total solar eclipse will occur with the earth crossing the shadow of the moon. The whole continent will experience a partial eclipse lasting 2 to 3 hours(weather permitting). The day will turn to night. The only way to safely look directly at an eclipsed sun is through special-purpose solar filters, such as "eclipse glasses" or hand held solar viewers. **The concentrated solar rays will damage the filter and enter your eye(s) causing serious injury. Children 3 years of age or younger and those not mature enough to know the importance of following the viewing guidelines should not be permitted to view the eclipsed sun. Sunglasses are never a substitute for eclipse glasses. Just be careful!**

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION: Has been a practice here in the Consortium for sometime. Beginning with the 9:00 a.m. School Mass during the school year; and when school is not in session, following the 8:00 a.m. daily Mass; and lasting until 3:00 p.m. Benediction. During those hours of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, there should be 2 people in attendance, at all times. Six or seven hours means 12-14 people need to be present, during the day. Sign-up sheets the week preceding Adoration can be found in the back of the Church. Due to the lack of participants it is being considered to discontinue this Adoration custom. September 1st will be the next scheduled First Friday Adoration which will be held. Please consider this time spent with Our Lord!
