**From the Desks of the Administrator**

**Friday Mass** – Occasionally, there have been some difficulties with the Friday Mass times as the time will switch between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., depending on whether there is a school Mass or not. Since we have had some confusion surrounding the Friday Mass, for the sake of consistency from here on out, we will be having Mass at 9:00 a.m. on Fridays, whether it is a School Mass or not. We hope that this will avoid confusion in the future and better serve the community.

**Solemnity of All Saints** – On November First, we celebrate All Saints Day. While on various days throughout the year we celebrate a particular saint or saints, this is a special time for us to celebrate all the Church Triumphant. Those who have gone before us in the faith, who have gone to their heavenly home, the Holy Ones, the Saints are worthy of our veneration. This feast day is a joyous celebration meant to honor those Saints and to inspire us who yearn to join them in heaven one day. As we are united to them through our Baptism, we hope to be in eternal communion with them and with the Triune God. For this reason, the Church has indicated that this is to be a special day set aside for prayer and worship. It is a Holy Day of Obligation for us in which we are required to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. In the Perry County Consortium, we will be offering Masses for the Solemnity of All Saints on Tuesday, October 31st and Wednesday, November 1st.

On October 31st, Mass will be at 6:30 p.m., at the Church of the Atonement and at St. Bernard. On November 1st, Mass will be at St. Rose at 9:00 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 7:00 p.m., and at St. Patrick at 6:30 p.m.

Due to the evening Masses, the Tuesday, 12:00 noon Mass and Holy Hours for Tuesday, October 31st, and Wednesday, November 1st will be cancelled.

**The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed** –

On November 2nd, the Church celebrates All Souls Day. We know that when we depart from this world we may not yet be in a state of perfection. But, we know that while Our Lord is just, He is also most merciful. Should we pass away still seeking the perfection in the holiness to which our God calls us, we know that in His mercy, God has given us the opportunity to be cleansed from any of the sin to which we still may cling in purgatory. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “All who die in God’s grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.” (CCC, 1030) While purgatory may not be pleasant, there is a joy in the knowledge that one day we will be in heaven with Our Lord. We know that we can be of assistance to those who have gone before us who are members of the Church Suffering. The Church has always encouraged us to pray for the dead as well as “almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance” (CCC 1032) for the benefit of the dead. We may also offer our prayers for the dead in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. “From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God.” (CCC 1032) While we are encouraged to pray for the dead throughout the entire year, the Church sets aside November 2nd, All Souls Day, as a special day for us, as a Church to pray for the faithful departed.

While All Souls Day is not a Holy Day of Obligation, we will expand our normal Mass times to include an additional 6:00 p.m. Mass at St. Rose. At the request of some parishioners, this Mass will be celebrated in a way known as “Ad Orientem.” This way of celebrating Mass is one in which the priest and the people face the same direction during the celebration. This is an ancient form of celebration and was the predominant manner of celebration for the majority of the history of the Church. Today, this way of celebration is often seen as the priest “turning his back to the people.” This is not the intention of this way of celebrating Mass, but rather “The priest offers Mass facing the same direction as the people, because he and the people together are offering worship and sacrifice to God. He is not turning his back on the people to exclude them. Rather, as a Christian community, are all facing *ad orientem* (i.e., toward the east) [that is, liturgical East] waiting in joyful expectation for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Understandably, this type of celebration can be jarring and off-putting to some who do not desire it or are not disposed to receive it. Due to the possibility that some may not wish to worship in this format, we are having this Mass outside of our regular time. Those who desire this kind of worship, or are at least interested in it, are encouraged to participate. For those who simply would like to worship and offer their prayers for the dead on All Souls Day in the way to which they are accustomed, we will still be offering our regular Masses on November 2nd. We are simply adding an additional Mass.
